The ramp is significant in that it is often a first point of entry for people in need who come to our campus in search of food, shelter and other assistance.

Preparations for the intensive work day began in the weeks prior to the event. Crews were here to assess, measure and lay groundwork for the designated day when the entire GE IT team arrived *en masse*. That day, the GE crew began at sunrise and worked all day on the sturdy new structure.

Volunteers Refurbish SVDP

ore than 150 GE employees donated their time and efforts the last week of April to help refurbish St. Vincent de Paul's inner-city campus.

The hard-working volunteers—all with GE's IT department—completed a variety of projects including painting, refinishing the wood floors in our Open Hand Kitchen, and preparing the kitchen basement for our new food pantry.

GE donated materials for the work days at St. Vincent de Paul. In addition, the company gave washers and dryers to DePaul Apartments for homeless women and children.

"The assistance from the GE volunteers has been invaluable," said Ed Wnorowski, executive director of SVDP. "We would not have been able to accomplish these significant campus improvements without them."

Long before this work project took place, GE was already a loyal corporate partner. Through a program for current and retired employees, GE generously matches contributions its employees and retirees make to St. Vincent de Paul. When financial gifts are designated for food and shelter, GE even doubles the match.

A focal point of GE's massive work project here was the rebuilding of the ramp outside the front doors of Ozanam Inn men's homeless shelter and our Open Hand Kitchen.



At lunchtime, the GE team paused to dedicate the new ramp to the memory of Jonathan Cunningham, a member of the GE IT team and president of the GE Volunteers Council. A husband and father, he died in March at the age of 31.

Cunningham's widow was on hand as a small plaque honoring her late husband was installed on the new ramp. The sign will serve as a reminder to all those who enter St. Vincent de Paul that there are many kind people in this world who care about others in need.

Recently, I received this letter from a grateful parent of one of our clients. I shared it with my staff as a reminder of why we are all here at St. Vincent de Paul. With her permission, I would also like to share her letter with you, our faithful donors. It's because of your loyalty and support that we are able to offer help, hope and encouragement for people trying to restore their lives.

Dear Mr. Wnorowskí,

Last month my daughter graduated from St. Jude [Women's] Recovery Center after 14 months of treatment. It is technically a six-month program but, as she said when she got up to speak, it took her six months just to get honest.

When she walked into the room, it was like I was seeing her recovery for the first time. She looked so beautiful and whole, smiling and hugging everyone. I realized that the image I still had of her in my head was of a sometimes violent, always belligerent, physically and emotionally emaciated shell of a human being.

It was a long road that began with me hauling her out of jail for the first time when she was 13, then four or five more times until she turned 18. She estimates she has been arrested 12 to 15 times since, but is not really sure. She still has legal issues to resolve, and still has "time on the shelf" (which means if she does anything at all she will have to serve her remaining time), but she is dutifully going to court and making restitution.

In the past, she only kept a job long enough to get a check and some drug money. She has held her current position for just over a year. She is healing her relationship with her son and providing a safe and loving home environment for him.

Today, as my daughter and I were out shopping, she talked about her time at St. Jude's as she frequently does. I said, "St. Jude's saved your life." We both already knew this. It just felt good to be able to say it out loud.

Thank you for everything you have done for my daughter, my family and for all the other women and families you have helped.
