Margaret has been a Vincentian since the 1980s and has been helping families and doing home visits in her area ever since. In addition, she is part of Mary Queen of Peace serving team that comes to the Open Hand Kitchen monthly to serve meals.

The final award, the Top Hat Award, is the highest honor presented by the Conference Affairs Committee. This award is presented to a Vincentian who exemplifies the spirit of our founder, Frederic Ozanam. This year that honor goes to John Raque of the St. Raphael Conference.

A huge supporter of all programs on the St. Vincent de Paul downtown

campus, John is constantly recruiting volunteers for the food pantry and the Open Hand Kitchen. When hearing that the freezers in the food pantry were having problems, John organized and administered a special collection for the new walk-in freezer.
