Ozanam Inn Renovation Project Complete

"Everyone should have a clean place, a safe place to sleep," said Executive Director/CEO Ed Wnorowski, as he addressed those gathered for the rededication of Ozanam Inn, our homeless men's shelter here at St. Vincent de Paul Louisville.


With the support from a Louisville Metro Government Emergency Solutions Grant and matching donations from Fifth Third Bank Foundation, the Gheens Foundation, and many generous individuals, we were able to update critical areas in this high-use facility. Renovations include new restrooms, counseling spaces, HVAC, security, fire alarms, LED lighting, and an emergency generator. We were also able to renovate the 20 individual rooms reserved for homeless veterans. These renovations will assure a clean, safe environment for the 90 men who seek shelter nightly. "The scope of this project really was transformative. We are absolutely thrilled and appreciate everyone's

contribution," said Jennifer Clark, Director of Programs at St. Vincent de Paul Louisville.

In direct response to the street homelessness crisis, we've made great strides in reducing the barriers that many individuals face when choosing to seek shelter. Also, in response to best practices identified in a report published by the University of Louisville (Solving Street Homelessness; June 11, 2019) we are implementing trauma-informed best practices to better serve our neighbors experiencing homelessness. The improvements to Ozanam Inn are more than cosmetic. Renovations include new restrooms, counseling spaces, HVAC, security, and an emergency generator.

Louisville is building on the success of adding case management as a shelter service. "Case management is the catalyst that moves people to self-sufficiency," Wnorowski said. "Our outcomes validate this approach." On average 7–10 shelter guests are moving into permanent housing in any given month, and over 50 have moved into housing since January 1, 2019.

We want to thank all the donors that made this project possible. Their support ensures Ozanam Inn will continue to provide shelter to those in need for years to come.

New Program Launches This Fall to Address Youth Homelessness

We are excited to announce to that this fall we will be partnering with the Home of the Innocents to prevent and end youth homelessness. Through funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Youth Homeless Demonstration Program (YHDP), we will house 24 young people that are experiencing homelessness, including unaccompanied and pregnant or parenting youth.

In addition to housing, the youth will also receive case management with a goal of transitioning to permanent housing.

Along with ten other communities across the country, Louisville was awarded the HUD YDHP grant in July 2018. The Coalition for the Homeless put together a group called the Homeless Youth Committee and asked them to develop a plan for ending homelessness among youth and young adults in Louisville and consulted with a representative group of youth known as the Youth Action Board.

St. Vincent de Paul Louisville and the Home of the Innocents submitted a joint proposal to provide services and housing. Our partnership, along with five other agencies, was awarded the funds and will be participating in this coordinated community effort.

This effort will go a long way to address the problem of youth homelessness, but there's still work to do, and more resources are needed.

What You Can Do to Help

In a few weeks, St. Vincent de Paul Louisville will be launching our "Help Make It A Home" program to address some basic needs our clients have once they are housed with us. The program will benefit Roberts Hall, the SRO, and other campus housing programs, including the new YHDP program.

We'll post a gift registry with links to linens and pillows, pack 'n plays, baby wipes, trash cans—all the things someone needs when setting up a home.

Your support of this program will help us provide a warm and welcoming environment for the new faces and help to prepare them for the next stage of their life.
