Housing



SVDP provides shelter and permanent housing for 450 individuals and families both on our campus and in scattered-site housing. We serve people regardless of background or faith with the goal of each person achieving self-sufficiency. Here are several on and off-site housing programs.

Ozanam Inn Men's Emergency Shelter

- Ozanam Inn provides emergency shelter and supportive services to single men. It is the only shelter in Louisville to provide 24/7 access to shelter beds.
- We have 50 beds, including 10 private rooms, with no daily check-out required to stay at this emergency shelter.
- Our Veterans Transitional Housing Program has 20 beds and Veterans are currently accommodated in the basement of Ozanam Inn.



Domestic Violence Transitional Housing & Rapid Rehousing Program This joint program addresses those who are homeless due to fleeing domestic

violence. The transitional housing component has 18 rooms that provide up to 37 beds at a secure site. The rapid rehousing component is scattered-site housing with 43 units and up to 75 beds.

East and West Family Apartments

- 12 two-bedroom and 8 three-bedroom apartments for homeless families **DePaul Family Apartments**
- 12 two-bedroom apartments for homeless families

One Bedroom Apartments

10 one-bedroom apartments for individuals and/or couples

Tranquil House Apartments

- 12 efficiency apartments for those with a chronic mental illness **Waypoint House**
- 24 single room occupancy units for homeless male or female Veterans Scattered-Site Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH)
 - PSH with 73 units for homeless individuals and families off-campus where at least one member of the household has a disability

- Saint Paul Catholic Church was converted into the Open Hand Kitchen in 1983, when it was gifted to Saint Vincent de Paul Louisville.
- The OHK serves free meals for lunch and dinner at 12 p.m. and 5 p.m. every day of the year to anyone who walks through its doors.
- We serve roughly 10,000 free meals on a monthly basis.

Food Pantry

- The Food Pantry is 100% volunteer-run and is open on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9 a.m. to Noon.
- Clients receive fresh produce, frozen meats, poultry, fish, and pantry staples to meet their needs.
- We serve more than 500 households each month.

The Family Success Center

- The Family Success Center supports families and individuals so that we can enrich their family life. We provide year-round educational and social development opportunities for at-risk children.
- We have roughly 40 elementary and middle school students who are actively involved in our after-school programming and summer camp.





- The purpose of this program is to address the underlying causes of homelessness, such as addiction, mental illness, and trauma history.
- All clients have access to individual and group counseling with licensed mental health professionals on staff.
- Clients receive one-on-one counseling to meet their needs.
